

**Overview of the Polk Works Region  
October 21, 2011**

The unemployment rate in Polk County was 12.0 percent in September 2011. This was a decrease of 1.1 percentage points from the rate the county posted in the same month last year. In September 2011, Polk County's unemployment rate was 1.4 percentage points higher than the state rate of 10.6 percent and 3.2 percentage points above the national rate of 8.8 percent. Out of a labor force of 272,748, there were 32,621 unemployed Polk County residents.

In September 2011, total nonagricultural employment in the Lakeland-Winter Haven metro area was 190,800. Total nonagricultural employment decreased by 1.1 percent over the year, compared to a statewide increase of 1.1 percent.

Only two of the ten major industry groups gained employment over the year. These were trade, transportation, and utilities (+800 jobs); and education and health services (+300 jobs).

Over-the-year job declines in the Lakeland-Winter Haven metro area easily offset the job gains, as eight of the ten major industry sectors posted lower employment levels. The industries losing jobs were professional and business services (-700 jobs); leisure and hospitality (-600 jobs); government (-600 jobs); mining, logging, and construction (-500 jobs); other services (-300 jobs); manufacturing (-200 jobs); financial activities (-200 jobs); and information (-100 jobs).

Government employment showed a decline of 600 jobs over the year, as local government agencies had the bulk of the public employment reductions.

Employment growth was strongest in trade, transportation, and utilities; which increased by 1.8 percent over the year. This increase was a result of strong growth in retail trade (4.6 percent).
